

SENIOR MASTER SERGEANT CHARLES E. HOLMAN



Senior Master Sergeant Charles E. Holman is a Test, Measurement, and Diagnostic Equipment (TMDE) Superintendent of the Mountain Home Air Force Base (AFB) Precision Measurement Equipment Laboratory (PMEL) located in Mountain Home, Idaho. Sergeant Holman was born on 7 June 1979 in Fountain Valley, California. After graduating high school in 1997 from Lake Elsinore, California he entered basic training at Lackland AFB, Texas in October of that same year. Upon completion of basic military training, he attended the PMEL technical training school located at Keesler AFB, Mississippi and graduated in 1998. Sergeant Holman was then sent to his first duty assignment at Langley AFB, Virginia. In January 2002, Sergeant Holman was assigned to Osan AB, South Korea with a follow-on assignment to Ramstein Air Base (AB), Germany in 2003. During his tenure at Ramstein AB, Sergeant Holman deployed to Al-Udeid AB, Qatar where he served as a calibration technician supporting operations ENDURING FREEDOM and IRAQI FREEDOM. In 2008, Sergeant Holman left Germany for an assignment at Nellis AFB, Nevada where he filled the roles as a PMEL Section Supervisor and PMEL Quality Manager before serving in a greater capacity organizationally as the Compatible Development Systems Analyst Noncommissioned Officer in Charge (NCOIC), or Base Encroachment Office NCOIC. Following a promotion to Master Sergeant, he assumed duties in April 2012 as an Air Force Metrology and Calibration (AFMETCAL) PMEL Evaluator and in 2013 was quickly promoted to Lead Evaluator. His roles were to lead and mentor evaluation teams comprised of USAF Senior NCOs tasked by Air Staff to evaluate United States Air Force and Foreign Military PMELs. He ensured the overall safety, accuracy, reliability and traceability of over 640,000 Test, Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment items, valued at over 721 million dollars supporting every weapon system in the United States Air Force inventory. After departing AFMETCAL in June 2015, he arrived at his next duty station at Langley AFB, Virginia. He assumed the role as the PMEL Program Acquisition Management and Integration Center (AMIC) Deputy Program Manager overseeing a \$450M contract portfolio and designing risk analysis reports for 29 contract PMELs across the globe. In 2016, Sergeant Holman was promoted to Senior Master Sergeant and assumed the role as the AMIC's Senior Enlisted Leader advising and mentoring 400 civilian and military personnel and providing resources to enable the execution of a 15 billion dollar contract portfolio. Lastly, Sergeant Holman was once again tasked to solve another problem and packed his family up in August 2017 for their move to Mountain Home AFB. Sergeant Holman's decorations include the Air Force Meritorious Service Medal with one oak leaf cluster, the Air Force Commendation Medal with two oak-leaf clusters, the Air Force Achievement Medal, the Air Force Good Conduct

Medal with four oak-leaf clusters, the National Defense Service Medal, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Service and Expeditionary Medals, and the Korean Defense Service Medal.
